Under-Secretary for Home Affairs Officiates at HSMC's Sustainability Event – "Nurturing Women Entrepreneurs via Socio-cultural Innovations"

Building on the success of the "First large scale Forum on Sustainable Development in Higher Education" in July, a follow-up sustainability-related activity "Nurturing Women Entrepreneurs via Socio-cultural Innovations" took place at Hang Seng Management College on 24 September 2015. It is our honour to have Ms Florence Hui Hiu-fai, SBS, JP, Under-Secretary for Home Affairs of HKSAR Government to officiate at the opening session. She described the situations of social enterprise in Hong Kong and around the world, and encouraged students to participate in the Hong Kong Social Enterprise Challenge. Professor Gilbert Fong, Provost, appreciated the efforts of Hong Kong women in starting up business and contributing to the economic development. Three speakers were invited from different industries to convey knowledge, experience, and message related to chiropractic, and the use and the impacts of aromatherapy.

During this event, two messages are expected to be brought out:

- 1) Helping women to develop awareness in innovative use of technology, media, aromatherapy, music and color for well-being of the community; and
- 2) Developing the capabilities of women to be pioneers in identifying entrepreneurship opportunities with sustainable value and responsibility for the community and society at large.
