About Tsim Sha Tsui District Kaifong Welfare Association

Tsim Sha Tsui District Kai Fong Welfare Association was established in 1953 as a non-profit welfare organisation, operating over 70 years of history. Its main purpose is to emphasise the principles of "mutual support, shared interests, assistance in times of need, and changing customs," providing education, elderly care, medical, and youth services to the community without discrimination based on race or religion.

To promote educational development in Hong Kong, the Association funds various local universities for educational development purposes and sponsors students for overseas exchanges, allowing them to broaden their horizons and knowledge. Additionally, it has established schools under Project Hope in Guangdong, Guizhou, Hebei, and Xinjiang provinces to provide educational opportunities for students in mainland China.

In terms of elderly services, the Association operates the Tsim Sha Tsui District Kaifong Association Neighborhood Elderly Activities Centre for almost 30 years, which provides appropriate services for local seniors including health and community education, consultation and referral services, volunteer services, caregiver support, social and recreational activities, counseling, group and interest classes, as well as outreach programmes for hidden elderly individuals.

Regarding medical services, the Association provides dental care services for the community. It also collaborates with local universities to promote the Compendium of Materia Medica and traditional Chinese medicine culture, while providing traditional Chinese medicine healthcare services to the community.



The Association is committed to the development of youth in Hong Kong, operating a scout troop aimed at instilling virtues of public service, kindness, unity and cooperation among young people and cultivate positive values.
