HSUHK's Institute of Knowledge Exchange organises symposium on "Integrating Culture, Sports, and Tourism: Unleashing Possibilities"

The Institute of Knowledge Exchange (IKE) at The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong (HSUHK) hosted a symposium titled "Integrating Culture, Sports, and Tourism: Unleashing Possibilities" on 3 October in collaboration with the Tourism, Heritage & Sports Education Hub; the Greater Bay Area Medical Professional Development Association; Asia Academy for Sports and Fitness Professionals; and Ko Live Media.

Distinguished speakers from the culture, sports, and tourism sectors included Mr Ivan Wong, Chief Executive of Ocean Park; Mr Ip Ka-po, Director of Creation TV; and Mr Heung Pak-wing, IFMA International Gold Champion, who shared invaluable insights into their respective fields. Their presentations deeply resonated with attendees, and sparked meaningful discussions on the vital role of culture, sports and tourism in Hong Kong's economy and society.
