HSUHK signs MoU with SuiGang Link Consulting Company Limited to deepen Hong Kong-Guangzhou collaboration in youth innovation and entrepreneurship

The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong (HSUHK) and SuiGang Link Consulting Company Limited have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in Nansha, Guangzhou, to jointly promote collaboration in youth innovation and entrepreneurship incubation, resource integration, and project implementation.

Key areas of cooperation include expanding access to mainland entrepreneurial resources, co-organising exchange activities, entrepreneurship courses, Nansha study tours, and workshops. In addition, HSUHK will have free access to the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Youth Innovation Center (Nansha IFC) under SuiGang Link to jointly organise innovation and entrepreneurship activities.

The MoU was jointly signed by Dr Ken Yau, Head of Global Affairs at HSUHK, and Mr Hugo Lin, General Manager of SuiGang Link. Dr Yau said that the collaboration will not only further expand HSUHK's partnership network in supporting student innovation and entrepreneurship in the Greater Bay Area, but also provide a valuable platform for students to engage with the innovation ecosystem and broaden their cross-boundary development perspectives. The active participation and sharing of youth start-up teams also demonstrate that Nansha has become an important hub for attracting talent and promoting innovation and entrepreneurship, creating more opportunities for exchange and collaboration between Hong Kong and the Chinese Mainland.

A sharing session of HSUHK Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE)'s "GBA Youth Start-up and Social Innovation Programme" was also held at the event. This year's programme selected 13 outstanding start-up teams. Three of the teams—PrimeUnity Education, UltraGuardian Co., Ltd., and The Peel—shared their innovative practices in education technology, intelligent welding, and the health industry related to dried citrus peel beverages, and explored the opportunities and challenges of entrepreneurship in the GBA. Since its establishment, CIE has incubated more than 100 start-up teams, covering areas such as artificial intelligence, green technology and social innovation.

Speaking at the event, Ms So Tsz-yin, Deputy Director of the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office in Guangdong, expressed her expectation that Guangdong-Hong Kong collaboration will further promote youth exchanges and innovation development.
