Indeed, Mr Yim has projects all over Hong Kong: they are all significant landmarks or recognizable icons of the city, including the Government Headquarters in Admiralty, the IFC I & II, the Citibank Tower in Central, the Peninsula Hotel extension, the Four Season Hotel, and the Central Police Station Heritage Project, just to name a few; but his influence extended beyond Hong Kong to other cities, being the designer of the Guangdong Museum in Guangzhou and the Yunnan Museum in Kunming.

Architecture has been regarded as the mother of all arts – it is also in this spirit that our Department of Art and Design was set up to integrate the pedagogical approach and teaching methodology in architecture in the comprehensive curriculum of art and design, aspiring to educate a new generation of artists and designers well versed with history and theory, adept in applications and technology, sensitive with the environment and sustainability, and well aware and cognizant of professional ethics and civic morality.

As the best accomplished local architect, Rocco will share with us his latest visions and ideas in architectural design and his lecture today titled "Museum and Beyond" would be most relevant and inspiring to us in our endeavours to shape and deliver a most unique programme for our students.
